SYNOPSIS

Stuffed is a documentary feature film about the surprising world of taxidermy. Told through the eyes and hands of acclaimed artists across the world, the film explores this diverse subculture, where sculptors must also be scientists, seeing life where others only see death. From an all-female studio in Los Angeles that has



elevated taxidermy to the forefront of fashion and modern art, to fine artists in the Netherlands, these passionate experts push creative boundaries. The film highlights a diversity of perspectives including an anatomical sculptor in South Africa and a big game taxidermist in Ohio. And, in an unexpected twist, Stuffed reveals the importance of preserving nature, using taxidermy as its unlikely vehicle, and the taxidermist as its wild driver.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

When Executive Producer Rachel Price and I first embarked on *Stuffed*, a documentary about taxidermy, we could not have been two more unlikely candidates. I remember the day she brought it up to me, and I thought "Gross! I'm a vegetarian and I love animals." But Rachel gave me a couple of articles and a historical reference to review that changed my mind within two days. Exploring taxidermy made perfect sense, though. We are conditioned to embrace stereotypes as truth, and from my experience stereotypes are almost never the norm.

I couldn't believe how ignorant I had been about a subject so close to the thing I love most: animals. The environment, nature, and animals have always been what interests me most about this world. Growing up, it was always thrilling to see wildlife and this obsession followed me to college. I have a Masters of History with a focus in Environmental History and wrote my graduate thesis on a woman who turned her backyard into a woodland bird and animal sanctuary, while she was fighting the government to stop spraying DDT. I studied her for two years and this experience gave me an appreciation for the underdog, for those willing to push boundaries and make sacrifices for what they believe in. It was at that point I knew these were the stories I wanted to tell.

I knew that I would be the right director to make this film. I thought precisely what most people think about taxidermy, so I could see both sides. Since graduate school, I have been looking for a way to make a documentary about environmentalism and protecting nature without being finger-waggy and depressing, and taxidermy is the perfect artistic vehicle to do this!

These people love animals. They protect animals. They donate time, money, and skill to nature conservancies to help connect our future generations to nature. They are funny, and kind, and wild. Best of all, they are a fascinating breed of human that is highly proficient at both science and art.

To be successful like the artists we follow in the film, taxidermists must understand sculpting and painting, and they need to have a grasp of chemistry and biology, animal behavior, movement, and they need to know hundreds of species' habitats. They are a misunderstood collective of scientists and artists, who use both sides of their brains to complete each and every mount. It is the most fascinating subject I never knew existed.

So, when viewers watch this documentary, I hope they will see the passion these taxidermists have for animals. I hope that by breaking the stereotype of what a taxidermist looks and sounds like, audiences will think twice about the next judgement they place on a group they know little about first hand. I hope they see conservation through a new artistic lens. And I hope they have fun!

It has been a life changing experience and absolute dream come true making *Stuffed* across six countries, for two years, with my Canadian-American crew family. I am excited to bring it to audiences first at SXSW.

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR - ERIN DERHAM

Erin Derham, is an international award winning film director who began her career editing and directing for PBS. After receiving an MA in History, she founded History Boutique Films, and made *Buskin' Blues* numerous awards, screened at 11 film festivals, a music documentary



exploring the secretive lives of street performers. It won internationally, and was released for worldwide distribution in 2016 by Red Bull TV. Her other films include *Julian Price*, a historical documentary about an inspirational philanthropist, and *Blue Air*, a narrative film following a young mother and child finding strength in the great outdoors. Derham's passion for filmmaking is shown on screen by exploring the human experience and her creative fury is evident in all of her work. Music is an obsession, and becomes integral to her storytelling process.

TAXIDERMY ARTISTS FEATURED IN STUFFED

ALLIS MARKHAM

Allis Markham, owner of Prey Taxidermy, is an award-winning taxidermist based in Los Angeles, California. Recently, she was named 'Third in the World' at the 2017 World Taxidermy Championships for her African Jacana.

Her clients include institutions such as the Los Angeles Natiural History Museum, Natural History Museum of Santa Barbara, Moore Lab of Zoology, The Huntington Library, The Frost Museum of Science, Colorado State University and The Getty. Her work can be seen in the new Gucci perfume ad, The Nomad Hotel, EB Florals and television shows such as Bates Motel.

Born in the small town of Madison, Indiana, Allis grew up with a love of both nature and art -- happily with a lack supervision that made exploring both possible. Her first career as the Director of Social Media Strategy for the Walt Disney Company however, was a far cry from her naturalist roots...

In 2009, Allis attended the Advanced Taxidermy Training Center in Montana. Upon her return to Los Angeles, she began volunteering at the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles. There she met her mentor, museum taxidermist Tim Bovard. Under his tutelage, Allis earned a staff position in taxidermy leaving her computer behind for good and picking up a scalpel. Today, she has an all-female taxidermy in the heart of downtown Los Angeles.

JAAP SINKE AND FERRY VAN TONGEREN

Based in Amsterdam, Sinke & van Tongeren have been creating and working together for almost two decades. They teamed up to do film, advertising, graphic design and taxidermy. Besides that van Tongeren also works for the Dutch Museum of Natural History in Leiden. Preparing for the very important scientific collection enables him to learn a broad variety of techniques and spend time with one of the largest and oldest taxidermy collections in the world.

Sinke & van Tongeren recognize the value of history. Both in an artistic and scientific way. They cherish the patience, perseverance and craftsmanship of these passed times. They use all of this to create fine taxidermy with a quality you haven't seen for a long time.

To seize animals in all their glory they've been studying old Dutch masters like Weenix, Hondecoeter and van Olen. In the 17th century they managed to portray the exotic animals – that were brought in by explorers like Darwin – in such a way it showed every flamboyant detail. Working in their style helps Sinke & van Tongeren to make their animals look alive and scintillating. Giving them a stage with the finest selection of antique materials makes the pieces even more unique and desirable.

TRAVIS C. DE VILLIERS

Travis C. De Villiers is a multiple award winning professional Anatomical Sculptor and Taxidermist which make a perfect combination of his love for the natural world and his ability to capture animals realistically through Anatomical studies. He was raised in Zimbabwe and schooled in



South Africa where the art of taxidermy found him as a young adult. Mother Africa - her wilderness and her wildlife are in Travis's blood.

Self-taught in his skills, Travis continues to push boundaries in the field of Taxidermy, driven by the pursuit of anatomical perfection and hyper-realism. His goal is to restore nature's most beautiful creatures with a fluid and realistic touch. In his work, he personally handles the design, sculpting, mounting and finishing touches of the animals entrusted to his care.

DANIEL MENG

Daniel is an award-winning taxidermy artist currently working out of Dakota Taxidermy in Bismarck, North Dakota. Born in Switzerland and raised in Ohio, Daniel is a passionate hunter and conservationist. He has traveled extensively to work on projects with some of the top taxidermy artists in the world and at the age of twenty-one, received the "Best in World" title at the World Taxidermy Show.
