A documentary celebrating the overlooked career of Bunny Yeager, once known as the "world's prettiest photographer," who helped popularize the bikini, Bettie Page, and the Playboy pin-up.

SUMMARY

Bunny Yeager, once heralded as the world's prettiest photographer, had a huge influence on 20th-century pop culture, though few people know her name. Whether by popularizing the bikini, helping discover Bettie Page, shaping the image of Playboy, or inventing the selfie, Bunny was a trailblazer whose work bucked against conservative 1950s America and helped pave the way for the feminist movement and the sexual revolution. Yet the very changes she helped usher in would soon render her a forgotten relic... until now. Featuring testimonies from Dita Von Teese, Bruce Weber, and Larry King, *Naked Ambition* is a rediscovery of a brilliant yet overlooked artist.



DIRECTORS STATEMENT

In 2012, Dennis embarked on a passionate quest to convince Bunny Yeager, a living legend, to share her extraordinary life on film. Undeterred by Bunny's initial reluctance, Dennis persisted for two years, fueled by an unwavering determination to unveil her captivating narrative. Finally, in 2014, Bunny agreed and plans rapidly materialized.

However, fate dealt a cruel hand on the day of Bunny's first interview. Despite falling ill and needing to reschedule, she was convinced she could summon the strength to join the set the next day, only for her condition to worsen overnight. Tragically, Bunny passed away ten days later, leaving the project in dormancy for five years.

Amidst this period of hiatus, Dennis and Kareem found themselves captivated by another tale—the poignant chronicle of Miami Beach's elderly population in the 1970s, immortalized through the lenses of two young photographers in "The Last Resort." As they wove this narrative, thoughts of a new collaboration emerged. Bunny's story emerged as the ideal follow-up to their previous partnership, offering a unique perspective on Miami's evolution and that of our society through Bunny Yeager's groundbreaking pin-up photography.

The project's revival in the fall of 2019 was met with the unforeseen obstacle of the COVID-19 pandemic, yet the team persisted, undeterred by the myriad challenges. Bunny's resilience, mirrored in her life journey, became a beacon of inspiration for us as filmmakers. Despite setbacks, and with the help of our remarkable producer and editor, Dia Kontaxis, our unwavering dedication to bringing Bunny's story to life persisted, drawing strength from her mantra of persistence and determination.

In many ways, the film's underlying message resonates beyond Bunny's era, echoing a timeless truth: never cease pushing forward in pursuing your artistic goals. The journey is fraught with challenges, but as Bunny's legacy reminds us, persistence is the key. The film serves as a testament to the indomitable spirit of creators, urging them to stay ready for the moment when everything aligns and to seize the opportunity to make an impact. Bunny surely did, and we hope this film is a testament to her indomitable spirit and artistry.

FILMMAKER BIOS

Dennis Scholl - Director/Producer

Dennis Scholl is an award-winning documentary filmmaker focusing on arts and artists. His interview subjects have included Robert Redford, Frank Gehry, Wynton Marsalis, Ai Wei Wei, and Tracy Emin. He is the director of the feature documentary *The Last Resort*, that he co-directed with Kareem Tabsch and which won the Miami Jewish Film Festival Audience Choice Award, received a national theatrical release, and is currently available on Netflix. He recently released *Lifeline*, the story of 50s Ab Ex Painter, Clyfford Still, distributed by Kino Lorber, and *Singular*, a documentary on Cecile Mclorin Salvant, three-time jazz vocal Grammy winner, which was awarded Best Documentary by the Haiti International Film Festival and it is currently screening in syndication on public television stations across the US, via American Public Television. He has received 23 regional Emmys from the National Academy of Television Arts and Science, all for documentaries on art and artists.

Kareem Tabsch - Director/Producer

Kareem Tabsch is an Emmy-nominated filmmaker whose work focuses on documenting that which exists on the fringes of mainstream society. His feature films include *Mucho Mucho Amor* (2020) *The Last Resort* (2018), which he co-directed with Dennis Scholl, and the short film *Dolphin Lover* (2015). Tabsch's work has been included at prestigious festivals like Sundance, SXSW, HotDocs and has been featured in outlets like The New York Times, Los Angeles Times and NPR among others. In 2020, Tabsch's film *Mucho Mucho Amor* was named one of the 20 essential Latino Films by The New York Times. It was nominated for Emmy, GLADD, Imagen Awards and named Best Latinx Film by the National Association of Latino Independent Producers. He was named a '40 under 40' Documentary filmmaker by DocNYC, America's largest documentary film festival. Tabsch is a first-generation American of Latino and Middle Eastern descent. Rush Limbaugh once said his work was contributing to the decay of American Society.

Konstantia Kontaxis - Producer/Editor

Konstantia Kontaxis is a filmmaker and media artist. She has created films on artists: Carmen Herrera, Anna Valentina Murch, Cundo Bermudez, Jose Bedia, Maria Sevastaki, Robert Zakanitch, Shan Shan Sheng and Brad Goldberg among others. Kontaxis has been awarded film commissions by the city of Miami and the Corning Museum of Glass of New York and video art commissions by Broward County and Miami Art Central. Her works have been screened at festivals, museums and galleries around the world including Rome, Venice (Art Biennale), New York (Tribeca Film Festival), Montreal (Art Fifa), Paris, Athens, Ankara, Lleida, Taipei, Miami (Art Basel). She has received honors at the Moondance Film Festival, Cleveland Film festival, Yorkton Film Festival, UFVA, Park City Film Music Festival. As an editor, she has worked for Israeli film director Amos Kollek, and New York photographer Brenda Ann Kenneally. Her professional credits also include production coordinator and script supervisor for several feature films. She is currently an associate professor and the director of the Motion Picture Program at the University of Miami School of Communication.

Ed Talavera - Cinematographer

Ed Talavera is an award-winning cinematographer of narrative and documentary feature films. Talavera's numerous film credits include work aired on HBO, Showtime, Cinemax, and theaters worldwide. His theatrical film credits include Sue, Perfect Prey, Queenie in Love, Bridget, and Mi Amor. Feature documentaries include One Water, Finding Gaston, Lifeline, and Singular. His films Landscape Sublime and Jen Clay: the Texture of Anxiety recently won Suncoast Regional Emmy Awards. Talavera's unique and evocative visual style has garnered international praise and awards. A graduate of New York University's Graduate Film program, Professor Talavera serves as the coordinator of the M.F.A program in the Department of Cinematic Arts at the University of Miami and faculty director of the Canes Film Festival, an annual showcase of student films.

Alex Fumero - Executive Producer

Alex Fumero is an Emmy-nominated producer, creative developer and writer. Recent credits include Mucho Mucho Amor (Netflix), an Official Selection of the 2020 Sundance Film Festival, SxSW Film Festival, True/False, Miami Film Festival and more, and the critically-acclaimed sketch show, I Think You Should Leave with Tim Robinson (Netflix/Irony Point). He previously served as Vice President, Original Programming, for HBO, where his projects included 2 Dope Queens, Random Acts of Flyness, the Untitled Jon Stewart Project, All Def Comedy, Any Given Wednesday with Bill Simmons, Felipe Esparza: Translate This and Chris Gethard: Career Suicide, among others. Prior to joining HBO, Fumero was Senior Director of Programming & Development for Fusion. Fumero is a member of the Television Academy, the Latinx writer's group G.O.A.L.S, and holds a BFA from NYU Tisch.
